- Region 4 – Adult with a disability who does not work for the State or a Center for Independent Living (Valley, Boise, Elmore and Ada Counties)-Living Independence Network Corporation (LINC) Service Area
- Region 6 - Adult with a disability who does not work for the State or a Center for Independent Living (Butte, Bingham, Bannock, Bear Lake, Caribou, Franklin, Oneida, and Power Counties) - Life, A Center for Independent Living Service Area
- Region 7 - Adult with a disability who does not work for the State or a Center for Independent Living (Lemhi, Custer, Butte, Clark, Freemont, Jefferson, Madison, Teton, Bingham, Bonneville, Minidoka, Cassia, Power, Bannock, Caribou, Oneida, Franklin, and Bear Lake counties) – Life, A Center for Independent Living Service Area
- Statewide - Adult who is blind or visually impaired who does not work for the State or a Center for Independent Living from any region
- Statewide - Young adult (18-26) with a disability from any region who does not work for the State or a Center for Independent Living
